From the Dean's Desk...

Greetings Fellow Alumni,

Hope everyone enjoyed their summer, it seems as though fall temperatures are here to stay. I am pleased to announce that your alma mater has achieved a 100% pass rate on the NCLEX-RN again in 2023! We will most likely be the only local program to receive this rating. The School of Nursing has achieved a 100% pass rate five out of the past seven years and has consistently exceeded state and national pass rates.

You may hear that most graduates are passing the state licensure exam this year with the introduction of the Next Generation NCLEX testing. The National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) believes that the new format measures the graduate's ability to use clinical judgment. Hospitals must remember that even though more graduates are passing the exam, they are still novice nurses who need supported and mentored.

Trinity Health System offers a scholarship/loan program to all Trinity School of Nursing students at the conclusion of the first year of the program. The scholarship/loan covers the tuition and fees of the second year of the program (fall, spring and summer), after all applicable other scholarships and state and federal grants are applied. In addition, the scholarship/loan includes an amount equivalent to the tuition and fee costs of the first year of the program (not including costs covered by other scholarships and state and federal grants). The first year scholarship/loan amount is reimbursed to the recipient after the completion of the first year of the program. In return for this scholarship/loan, the recipient agrees to accept full-time employment in a nursing related role with Trinity Health System for a period of at least two (2) consecutive years immediately following graduation and licensure. The ultimate outcome of this offer is that the student should end up with a free education. This scholarship opportunity coupled with a new Nurse Residency program makes employment at Trinity a very attractive option.

The nursing shortage continues to impact Trinity Health System plus most hospitals nationwide. The need to recruit individuals to Nursing has never been greater. The School of Nursing is initiating a Ready "SET" Go recruitment campaign. The "SET" stands for Simulation, Education, Technology. We plan to showcase the \$300,000 simulators that were purchased with CARES Act funds. High School students will be our target audience.

The long awaited new units on the Trinity West Campus are now anticipated to open by the end of 2023. Our students will be able to provide quality nursing care on state of art nursing units. Trinity Health System and the School of Nursing are committed to providing excellent care for the patients in our Community.

Hope to see all of you at the October meeting!




